Dog Eligibility

Fast CAT events are open to all dogs at least 12 months of age. Spayed or neutered dogs and/or dogs with breed disqualifications may be entered. **Females in-season may not participate.** Refunds (less online service fee if applicable) will be given for lameness, unfitness, or in-season females.

AKC Registration Required

All dogs must be individually registered with the AKC. This includes all AKC registered purebreds, Foundation Stock Service (FSS), Purebred Alternative Listing (PAL), and AKC Canine Partners.

Entries

Entry Method: First received. Online Entries preferred

Online Entries: Online entries will be accepted upon opening day and time of test opening until the event is full. Visit www.dogshow.com to enter online. Online entries will be turned off upon reaching daily limits and a waitlist will be maintained.

By Mail: Complete an official AKC entry form for each dog. ONE ENTRY FORM PER DOG. Multiple tests may be selected for the same dog on one entry form. Dogs may enter only once per competition test. Multiple entry forms for multiple dogs (maximum 10 entry forms) may be mailed together and paid with one check. Make checks **payable to Kennel Club of Texarkana** and mail your completed signed entry, and payment to: Jenn Riley, 727 Co Rd 3008, New Boston, Texas, 75570

Late and Day of Test Entries: Late and day of test entries will be available if limits allow. Checks will not be accepted. Cash or other form of instant payment will be required.

Withdrawing Entries: No entry fees shall be refunded if a dog is absent. Also, no entries will be refunded if a dog is disqualified, excused, or banned from competition by the event committee. Any entries pulled prior to pre-entry closing date must be made via email or mail and entry fees, less online service fee if applicable, will be refunded. Entries are unable to be pulled post-closing date.

Fun Runs: Fun runs may be available time permitting. Fun runs will be on a first come, first served basis subject to time availability. Competition runs take precedence.



Run of Day - Roll Call, Inspection, Running, Times/Ribbons

Check In is the time when participants are expected to check-in. Check-in is followed by inspection for fitness, lameness or "in season" females. We will run rolling roll call and these tests will run concurrently. You must check in each day **and** before each run.

Inspections: Dogs must be inspected for lameness, fitness, and for females in-season **before EACH run**. *This includes checking for females in season – EVEN if your female has been spayed.* [This is an AKC rule.](#) Measurements, as needed, are also completed at this time.

Rolling roll call: Fast CAT rolling roll call with concurrent tests. This means you arrive any time you like between 7pm – 11:45pm, get your dog inspected then get in line to run. All pre-entered dogs will be prioritized and will run ahead of day of show entries.

You are free to determine how much time your dog needs in between runs. You must wait at least 30 minutes before you may run in the second test.

Workers/volunteers may run their dogs prior to the first competitor, or their dogs may be added in during the evening.

If you aren't checked in by 11:45pm each night, you will forfeit your runs and refunds will not be given.

Running your dog: It is recommended that a slip-lead be used and that the dog runs without a collar. Dogs may wear any collar except: a choke collar, a collar with prongs, a harness, or an electronic training collar. **PRONG collars are NOT ALLOWED ANYWHERE ONSITE per AKC rules.** The collar should be snug to minimize the chances of the collar getting hung up on something during the run. Note: Owners may be asked to remove or tape tags to the collar if the inspection committee is concerned they may get hung up during the run. Owners may use clips or rubber bands to hold the dog's hair. Wrapping of legs is allowed but must be removed prior to each inspection. [The owner assumes all responsibility for the safety of the dog regarding the dog's collar and paraphernalia on the dog.](#)

Post Run & Times: If you have more than one run, return to the inspection area for re-inspection for lameness, fitness, and in-season females. If you have completed your runs to for the day, head to the ribbon table for your time and ribbon(s). Stickers for ribbons will be provided. It may take up to 30 minutes post run time for your sticker to be ready for you.

Awards

Qualifying Runs: All dogs who receive a qualifying score will receive a flat light blue ribbon for each competition run. Note: Fun Runs are not competition runs therefore will not receive an official ribbon but will receive their time.

New Title Ribbons will be offered for all dogs earning their BCAT, DCAT, FCAT/FCAT#.

Notice to All Exhibitors

Huntmaster: The Huntmaster is responsible for field safety and therefore they are in COMPLETE charge of all dogs and handlers on the field. In service to this responsibility, they have the authority to have the lure stopped if needed and signal the handler to retrieve their dog. All event participants and spectators MUST follow ALL instructions from the Huntmaster promptly and swiftly. The Huntmaster also ensures the lure is positioned correctly, the lure operator and timers are ready, and shall give the "Tallyho" verbal signal to release the dog.

Weather: This is a rain, snow, or shine event. In the case of extreme weather, the club and its committee may delay or cancel the event. If the club makes the determination to cancel the event, entry fees may be refunded. Please ensure you and your dog's comfort by bringing portable shade, shelter, water, etc.

Food: There are many restaurants within a 10-minute drive from the site.

Restrooms: Are climate controlled in the main building with running water.

Timers: Electronic timing system will be used with manual timing as a backup.

Liability: The event-hosting club, the event secretary, its agents, members, representatives, volunteers, etc., assume no responsibility for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors, handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children or spectators.

Ineligible Entries: Incomplete, unsigned, unpaid, late, conditional entries, or entries not containing the "Agreement" found on the Official AKC Entry Form will not be accepted. Electronic signature will be accepted.

Returned check fee of \$35 will be assessed for any check(s) returned for insufficient funds and must be paid via cash or with credit card prior to running in addition to the entry fees.

Media: All rights to televise, videotape, advertise, photograph, promote or otherwise exploit this event are vested in the club, or in persons to whom assignments of such rights have been made in writing by the club. All persons and animals attending these shows grant the club the right to use their likeness and voice in any matter without further consent.

Conduct: Persons exhibiting conduct detrimental to AKC /the Club/any dogs(s) and/or other person(s) will be asked to leave the test site.

Loose and uncatchable dogs: If your dog gets loose when it is not competing or if the dog is causing an excessive delay of the event because it refuses to be caught by the catcher you may be assessed a \$10 fine.

Veterinarian Advice: Exhibitors should follow their veterinarian's recommendation to ensure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites or infectious diseases and have appropriate vaccinations. Coursing is an athletic activity that can tax a dog's physical strength. Dogs that are overweight or out of condition may be at greater risk for injury and exhaustion. The Inspection Committee has the authority to disallow a dog's entry into a test, and in such instances, applicable entry fees, less service fee will be refunded.

In-season females: In-season females are not allowed to participate.

Fast CAT Summary Description

The Fast CAT Test is a timed 100-yard dash for dogs. It is meant to be a fun and healthy activity of interest to any dog owner. The following is a summary of how the event is structured.

How does Fast CAT Work?

1. Fast CAT is a timed straight race of 100 yards.
2. Dogs run singularly and there are no placements.
3. The dog's time to complete the 100-yard dash is converted into MPHs. The calculation to convert to MPH is as follows: $204.545 \div \text{dog's time} \times \text{handicap} = \text{POINTS}$.
4. A handicap system is applied to a dog's MPH to determine the number of points earned.
The handicap system is based on the height of the dog at its withers.
 - 18" or greater = handicap is 1.0
 - 12" up to less than 18" = handicap is 1.5
 - Below 12" = handicap is 2.0
5. Points=MPH multiplied by the dog's handicap
6. Fast CAT titles suffix titles are earned at designated milestones:
 - BCAT = 150 points
 - DCAT = 500 points
 - FCAT = 1,000 points
 - FCAT# = every additional 500 points
7. Top 20 by Breed by Year: The AKC Fast CAT website will feature the Top 20 Fastest Dogs by Breed by Year national standings. The standings will be updated as event results are processed.
8. Eligibility to participate: Open to all dogs at least 12 months of age that are individually registered/listed with the AKC. This includes dogs recorded in the FSS program, dogs with PAL numbers, or dogs enrolled in the AKC Canine Partners program. Females in-season may not enter. A dog may enter only once per event (An event number defines the event.)
9. An inspection committee shall inspect each entry for lameness, fitness to compete, and females in- season. The inspection committee is responsible for measuring the height at the withers if necessary.
10. Safety: Safety is of utmost importance. The event committee is responsible for ensuring the safety of the course, the equipment, and the conduct of those involved in the event. It is recommended that the event committee run a test dog before the start of the event to ensure that the equipment functions correctly and that all personnel understand their jobs.
11. The Start: Dogs may start up to 10 feet behind the starting line. There will be a line on the ground indicating the 10-foot mark.
12. The Finish: The run out is 40 yards. An owner or someone familiar with the dog will stand at the finish to catch the dog once the course has been completed. This person will need to have an appropriate collar and leash.

13. Timing Devices: The time to complete the 100-yard dash is recorded to the nearest 1/100th of a second (i.e. 9.11) Electronic timing system will be used with manual timing as a backup. If the timers fail, stopwatches will be used, and two timers will be positioned at the finish line. An individual at the start line shall signal with an arm drop the moment the nose of the dog crosses the start line. The timers shall start their stopwatches at the bottom of the arm drop. The timers shall stop their watches when the nose of the dog crosses the finish line. The times from the two stopwatches shall be averaged to determine the recorded time.
14. Lure Equipment: The event will be run with a battery powered continuous loop system. The lure operator and the lure equipment shall be safely positioned in a manner that does not interfere with retrieving the dogs at the end of the course.
15. Lure: A white plastic bag will be used for the lure.
16. Course/Fencing: The course is fenced with 4' orange plastic fencing with gates in the entrance and catch pens. This is a natural grass track with a 40 yard run out and 10' start box.
17. The Hunt Master has control of the course. In summary, the Hunt Master is in charge of all dogs and handlers on the field, shall ensure handlers understand safe release and retrieval procedures, shall provide the lure is positioned correctly, shall ensure the lure operator, timers, and starting line signal person are ready, shall signal the lure operator to start the lure and shall give the verbal signal "tallyho" to release the dog.
18. No entry fees will be refunded if the event cannot be started or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, extreme and/or dangerous weather conditions, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strikes or any other cause beyond the control of the club.
